PRE-EMPLOYMENT TRANSITION SERVICES

DSHS DIVISION OF VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION

Workplace Readiness: Soft skills training, time management, punctuality, financial literacy, mock interviews, resume building, accessing services/supports.

Work-Based Learning: Job shadowing, workplace tours, informational interviews, paid internships.

Self-Advocacy: Instruction on when/how to disclose disability. Instruction on when/how to request accommodations. Instruction on self-determination.

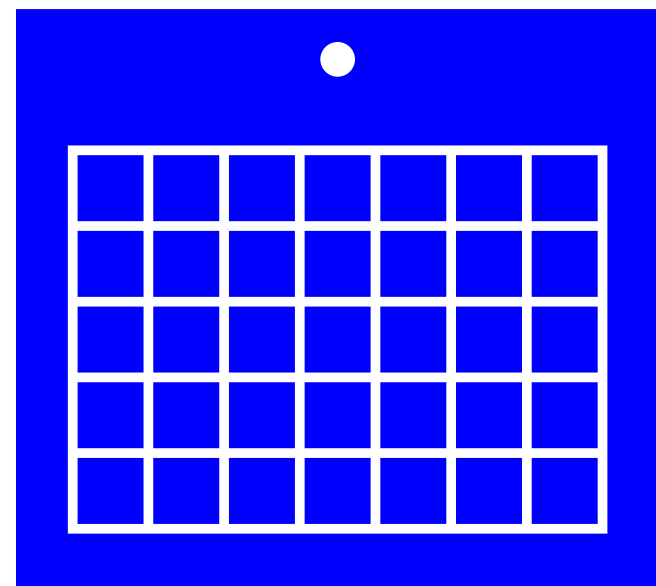

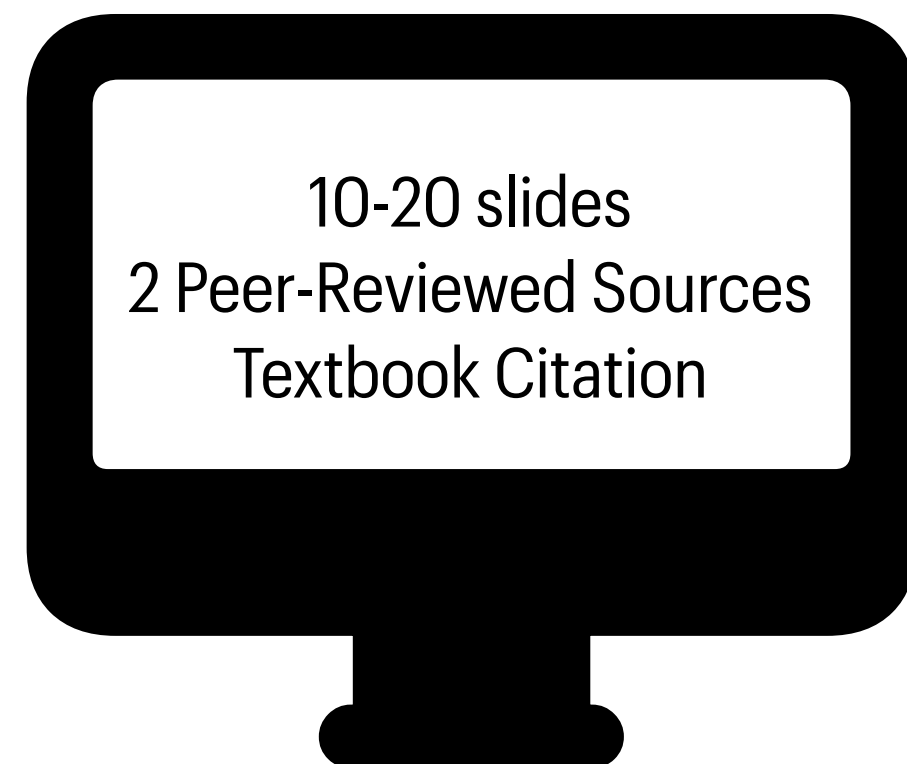
